In the Spotlight on LibCrowds.com

- Pybossa backend manages the validation of results
- Customised interface with Vue.js
- Results are available immediately
- Metadata added to item viewer by Collections Metadata team
- Over 2,800 registered volunteers internationally
- Over 265,000 contributions completed 157 sets of playbills.
- When live, has thousands of contributions weekly
- But hard to maintain without Research Software Engineers





Why we turned to Zooniverse?

- Over 2.5 million registered volunteers
- 90+ currently active projects
- Project Builder: https://www.zooniverse.org/lab
- Provision of user-friendly data analysis tools and apps, eg. ALICE (Aggregate Line Inspector and Collaborative Editor)
- Interest in collaborations to make use of existing community standards, eg IIIF

February 24th 2021, 9:35 am My institution uses IIIF (http://iiif.io/) to publish collection items. In the past, we've used the manifests to load items into a crowdsourcing interface for page-by-page (or canvas-by-canvas in IIIF terms) tasks. Using IIIF this way means we can draw images and metadata directly from the main access server and don't need to store them separately for crowdsourcing, which reduced our costs at the time but mightn't be as much of an issue for Zooniverse projects. It also means curators can easily add new items to tasks via the IIIF manifest URL. Has anyone tried using IIIF manifests to load subject sets into Zooniverse?





Drafting documentation to share at the IIIF conference....

1. Get the manifest link

I copied the manifest address I wanted, in this case from: 'A collection of playbills from Lyceum Theatre 1809-1821.

A note for using British Library manifest links: The 'IIIF' logo on the 'share' dialogue has the manifest link.

Copying that manifest link gives you a long version e.g.

https://api.bl.uk/metadata/iiif/ark:/81055/vdc_100022589296.0x000002/manifest.json? manifest=https://api.bl.uk/metadata/iiif/ark:/81055/vdc_100022589296.0x000002/manifest.json

But I only need the second half of the URL so I chopped off the part up to the '=' sign to get:

https://api.bl.uk/metadata/iiif/ark:/81055/vdc_100022589296.0x000002/manifest.json

- 2. Log into Zooniverse (this assumes you have appropriate permissions on the project)
- .. Log Into Zooniverse (this assumes you have appropriate permissions on the project)
- 4. Paste my IIIF manifest link into the box

your project will have a unique number that you will need to copy into the 'xxx' part of this link.

Zooniverse is probably the world's most popular crowdsourcing platform, used by dozens of cultural heritage organisations. But the resulting annotations from Zooniverse can be hard to use 'as is'. Do you want to learn how to turn Zooniverse data into something you can use in catalogues, on web pages or in research? Then this session is for you! Zooniverse: how to download and analyse your task annotations will introduce the widely used Zooniverse platform and the services it offers, and share new developments in using the Library's IIIF items on Zooniverse. Then we get hands-on! You'll learn how to process your annotations to obtain a clean and readable spreadsheet for your project.

If you are new to Jupyter Notebooks, may we suggest Daniel van Strien's "Introduction to Jupyter Notebooks: the weird and the wonderful".
